Why we're here The challenge

Underprivileged children in Egypt do not get equal opportunity to quality education either by not having access to education (in marginalized areas) or receiving poor quality of education due to the challenges in the public education system that include:

- → Teacher-centric learning approach
- → Focus on Academic achievement and ignoring all other aspects of child development
- _ Teacher-child ratio
- Violence and unsafe learning environment
 Focus on teaching content rather than
 using it as context to enhance lifelong
 learning skills critical for students to keep
 up with an ever- changing world.



What's missing

The market gap

Egypt is currently undergoing an education reform with a new curriculum launched that is more skill-based and has a student-centered approach to learning yet there are still challenges in gaining educators' buy-in for the change/reform. This coupled with the lack of contextualized professional development programs for public school educators who face challenges of overcrowded classrooms, limited infrastructure, resources are scarce and a shortage of teachers due to the freezing of hiring by the ministry. This resulted in poor quality of education in public schools and the goal of the education process is passing the test rather than learning.



What is needed

The solution

We believe that the only realistic model of success requires contextualized local solutions and ownership that can translate to enhanced teaching and hence, better learner outcomes. And therefore we developed a professional development program that is able to create





A learning journey not a training program

The STJ is a 3 year journey that starts with learning/training; however, a core component of the program is the blended and embedded learning that happens after the training. It comprises classroom observation, follow-up, monitoring and evaluation, and on-the-job coaching using various outlets.

The journey phases are designed to first build a common language among the school team and then second phase focuses on enabling the school team through practice and coaching and finally in the third phase, enabling selected school educators to sustain the learning within their schools to become a life long learning school.



The school as a unit of change


The STJ is a school-based reform program; targeting all school team to ensure institutional development rather than individual development. This aims to accelerate change through creating a common language and alignment of vision between the school staff.

Each of the school staff groups receives a specialized training program, catered to their needs and specialties, including a number of technical interventions for professional development to: improve educator performance; support school leadership that enables change; activate professional development unit/team; and engage community of practice to share knowledge and best practice across schools.



Enabled and Empowered Educators

To enable a path of change, learning and change occur in three integrated dimensions; knowledge, attitude, skills-building. This combination is designed to improve educators' performance, to enable individual and group initiatives, and to motivate educators to continue learning and developing their performances, enabling schools to become lifelong learning hubs.



A Change in Mindset

Educators mindset is a key driver/blocker to change. therefore, our main focus in the STJ program is to create a mindset shift towards learning and teaching that is aligned with 21st century skills and enables educators to become life-long learners and adopt a growth mindset that is then reflected on the students



A Humanistic Approach

Educate Me's believes that the educator is the most important pillar in the education process and therefore teachers' wellbeing is integral to having a human-centered learning environment.



Creating Sustainable Change

- → In order to ensure sustainability of the program, a professional development team inside the school (including champion teachers, principal and councelors) is activated and developed.
- → The program focuses on building the capacity of this team to be resposible for the ongoing learning and developing of the school.
- The professional development team has the ability to monitor the training needs of their peers and prepare a training plan to meet their needs.



We aspire to create Systemic Change in the education system in Egypt

Educate Me aims to scale its STJ program nationwide to drive wider change in the national system of teacher professional development. This will be done through a focus on:

- → Increasing our direct delivery of the program in more governorates and different geographical contexts
- → Running impact evaluations to validate the model in terms of scalability and sustainability.
- → Adopting a more strategic and proactive approach to communications and stakeholder relationships, with government and key education influencers



Why does it work

Even when teachers gain knowledge from professional development opportunities, it does not always result in changes in teaching practice (Copur-Gencturk and Papakonstantinou 2016; Gess-Newsome and others 2019; Lu and others 2019). Thus, professional development programs need to be designed to motivate teachers not only to participate and acquire knowledge but also to continue to apply their new skills




